Abstract: A literature review is a survey of key scholarly resources on a specific topic. It provides an overview of current & past knowledge, and also shows how your research is connected to that prior knowledge.. A literature review can be a section of a dissertation, journal article, research proposal or a publication.

This presentation discusses the steps when undertaking a literature review. It will also highlight the best practices in searching, discovery, and refining content, managing references, and synthesizing the information.
